"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus". (1 Thessalonians 5 v 16 to 18 NIV)

I once told a congregation that I'd been "happily married for 20 years. Actually married for 40 years but happily for 20!" Now, ok, it wasn't a very good joke and it will probably be another 20 years before Fiona sees the funny side — but there is something in there that needs thinking about.

At this stage, I should make it clear that next year will be our 'Golden' (50th) wedding anniversary and of course, every moment has been joyous, never a cross word - but it does beg the question, why do we put so much emphasis on remembering dates — and why is 50 more important than 49 or 51? I'm writing this just after the 20th anniversary of '7/7'. You're probably reading this just before 15th August, which marks the 80th anniversary of 'VJ Day'. More locally, I was lucky enough to be at the celebrations of Clifford Chapel's 170th anniversary and Collingham's 100th.

At the last of these, Eileen made the point that it's a chance to look back, celebrate and learn from the past, live for the present and have hope for the future. Three of the main festivals celebrated by our Jewish brothers and sisters reflect that:

Pesach (known to us as 'Passover') <u>remembers</u> the escape from Egypt (Exodus 12)

Rosh Hashanah is a time to reflect on the past year, good deeds and bad deeds and what can be done <u>now</u> to be a better person

Yom Kippur, also known as the day of Atonement when Jews <u>look forward</u> to the Final Judgement.

So, anniversaries serve a useful function, they are a trigger to take a step back and think about past, present and future – and that can be a good thing – but, maybe it's not enough! Paul encourages us to 'pray <u>always</u>....give thanks <u>in all circumstances'</u>. So, not just once every few years and not just when things are going well.

The Greeks (and remember Paul wrote in Greek) had two words for 'time'. The first, 'Kronos' is clock or calendar time – the one we use for all those anniversaries. The second, 'Kairos' is the perfect moment, the best time. It's when you first realised you were in love, the birth of a child, the time when someone went out of their way to help you, when a prayer was answered, that moment on holiday that you'll never forget. I'm rubbish at remembering dates (Kronos) – but good things that have happened in my life (Kairos), come back and I can feel those emotions all over again, just like they happened yesterday.

And I think that's what Paul was getting at. Any time, and in any circumstances, we can remember the good, give thanks and pray for ourselves and others. Maybe make a set time every day to do just that. (And, maybe my joke about remembering the happy years wasn't so daft after all - just don't ask Fiona if she's seen the funny side yet!)

Police Chaplain to Wetherby & Otley Stations

Working as a Chaplain, whether in a hospital, shopping centre, airport, prison or with the Police is a front line role. It puts you in a working environment alongside people doing their jobs with all the stresses and strains that those roles bring, as well as all the highs and lows in personal lives.

Earlier this year I felt the call to do something front line and so, having known chaplains in the various walks of life I decided to explore the role further. So, of course, I did what we all do and googled possibilities. The role of Chaplain to the Police stood out for me. I felt a real affiliation with the role description and decided to make further enquiries. To cut a long story short the result is that I have been appointed as Police Chaplain to the Wetherby and Otley stations. I now have to get to know those who work there. This means popping into the stations, talking to the officers and volunteers and going out with them on patrol. It is always much easier to get to know people when you are walking the street side by side or sitting together in a car, or tramping through the countryside on a rural mission. The police have had a hard time in recent years and the automatic public confidence has somewhat diminished. This adds to the strain of what is a very difficult, and at times very stressful job.

Having someone to talk to or unload some of the angst, is a way of supporting people who give much to the community. I hope in my role I can be one of those people.
